Hamilton Tree Planter

Description

The Hamilton Tree Planter is a uniquely Australian invention for revegetation planting.

The tool is used by pushing the tube template into the ground using foot peddles. The template removes a divot the size of the seedling tube to be planted. The tube is then inserted and watered in.

Square and round Tree Planters are available.



Specifier's tip

- Planting depth is determined by how far the planter is pushed into the ground.

Tree Spade – Standard

Benefits

Straight handle for better penetration into the soil.

Round mouth to reduce friction when sinking the spade into ground.

The narrow blade allows better penetration into harder soils achieving a good planting depth.
